

## God's energy and God's mass in the Holy Bible

According to the gospel, Jesus took bread, said blessing, broke it and gave it to his twelve disciples, and said, "This is my body." (Mar 14:22) "Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, 'this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed by many'" (Mar 14:23, 24)

Here, the ordinary bread, after Jesus took it, was no longer an ordinary one, but a mass of God after Jesus' blessing. Again, the ordinary cup of wine, after Jesus took it, was no longer an ordinary one, but a mass of God after Jesus' blessing. Therefore, both the bread and the wine became the mass of God because they were with the energy of God through Jesus.

Jesus is full of mass of God, therefore, full of energy of God. "For in HIM dwells the whole fullness of the deity bodily". (Col 2:9) "You share in this fullness in HIM, who is the head of every principality and power." (Col 2:10)
